Background Check Requirements:

The Executive Council of Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy Examiners (ECPTOTE) is mandated by statutory authority to conduct criminal history background checks for all applicants and licensees of physical therapists (PTs), physical therapist assistants (PTAs), occupational therapists (OTs), and occupational therapy assistants (OTAs) in Texas. This requirement is established under Texas Occupations Code Section 453.215 and Texas Occupations Code Section 454.217. In accordance with the amendments to the PT and OT Practice Acts, every individual seeking to obtain or renew a license in these professions must submit fingerprints for both state and national criminal history background checks.

Exempt Positions:

The Executive Director is the only exempt position within our agency. The salary for this position is governed by the General Appropriations Act, which sets a "not-to-exceed" rate for the Executive Director's annual base salary. However, it has become apparent that the current rate is insufficient and poses a significant challenge for the agency in terms of recruiting and retaining a qualified individual for this critical role.

The "not-to-exceed" rate established for the Executive Director is out of alignment with market conditions and the rising cost of living. This this misalignment will hinder the agency's ability to attract, retain or reward top talent, particularly given the competitive market for executive roles. Unlike employees classified under the State's Position Classification Plan, the Executive Director does not benefit from salary increases such as merit raises or one-time bonuses, making it even more challenging to offer a competitive compensation package.

To address these concerns, we propose an adjustment to the "not-to-exceed" rate for the Executive Director's salary. We recommend increasing the rate to \$129,765, which aligns with the maximum of the "Recommended Salary Range" as specified in the "Executive Compensation at State Agencies" report administered by the State Auditor's Office. This adjustment is essential to ensure that our compensation package remains competitive and reflective of current market conditions.

Purpose of Exceptional items request

To maintain a stable and effective workforce while adapting to evolving operational needs, our agency is seeking approval of our five exceptional items. Lump sum leave payouts and targeted equity adjustments are pivotal for sustaining employee morale and reducing turnover, which are essential for workforce stability. As living costs rise, aligning salaries with market rates and cost-of-living increases is critical for retaining skilled staff and filling key positions. Additionally, fair compensation for accrued leave supports smooth transitions and bolsters morale.

Funding exceptional items for modern technologies, such as Parchment for streamlined transcript processing, DocuSign for secure electronic document management, and advanced call center software, is vital for enhancing operational efficiency and service quality. These upgrades will automate processes, reduce manual workload, and improve accuracy, contributing to better performance and stakeholder satisfaction. Replacing owned copiers with newer, leased models will further support efficient document handling and operational workflows. These strategic investments are designed to not only meet current demands but also position our agency and stakeholders for long-term success.

EXCEPTIONAL ITEM REQUESTS (in priority order):

1. (Compensation Adjustments)

Lump Sum Leave Payouts and targeted equity adjustments are crucial for maintaining employee morale and reducing turnover, thereby ensuring workforce stability. As living costs rise, adjusting salaries to reflect market rates and cost-of-living increases is essential for retaining skilled staff, preventing gaps in key positions, and attracting top talent. Competitive compensation helps employees sustain their standard of living while fair leave compensation supports smooth transitions and morale. These adjustments are especially important as the agency undergoes technological advancements that impact business processes, necessitating a skilled and adaptable workforce. Addressing these needs through equitable compensation ensures the agency remains competitive and retains a capable team.

2. (Employee Training and Development)

Ensuring employees obtain necessary certifications and possess the required knowledge is vital for regulatory compliance and operational effectiveness. Investing in training and development programs not only helps meet these requirements but also makes the organization more attractive to top talent. Well-trained employees can better address customer needs, resolve issues promptly, and deliver high-quality service, enhancing customer satisfaction and loyalty. As technology evolves, targeted training is essential for staff to adapt to new systems and tools. In a competitive job market with rising living costs, offering competitive compensation and career development opportunities is crucial. By fostering continuous learning, the agency addresses skill gaps, improves operational effectiveness, and retains skilled personnel, supporting long-term success.

3. (Technology and System Upgrades)

Investing in modern technologies is crucial for enhancing our agency's operational efficiency and service quality. Parchment, which handles 90% of our transcripts,

streamlines processing by automating tasks, reducing errors, and expediting application handling. DocuSign enables secure electronic signatures and automates document workflows, cutting processing times and administrative costs while improving compliance and protecting against fraud. The new DIR call center software enhances customer interaction management with efficient call routing and performance analytics, thereby improving service quality and reducing downtime. Replacing our copiers with leased models ensures more reliable document handling, less maintenance, and better performance. Together, these upgrades represent a strategic investment in modernizing our operations and positioning our organization for future success.

4. (Exempt Position Compensation)

The Executive Director is the sole exempt position within our agency, and its salary is constrained by the General Appropriations Act, which imposes a "not-to-exceed" limit for the annual base salary. This rate, however, is increasingly inadequate, creating significant challenges for the agency in recruiting, retaining, and rewarding a qualified candidate for this pivotal role. The established salary cap is misaligned with current market conditions and the rising cost of living, impeding our ability to attract and keep top talent, especially in a competitive executive job market. Unlike other employees covered under the State's Position Classification Plan, the Executive Director does not receive merit raises or bonuses, further complicating efforts to offer a competitive compensation package.

5. (HEALTH PROFESSIONS COUNCIL)

HPC is funded by its member agencies, and as HPC's cost rise, the proportional financial contribution required from each member agency also increases.


6. (Texas.gov Increase)

The Texas.gov is a pass-through from the ECPTOTE to DIR for the purpose of funding Texas Online. As the estimated costs for Texas.gov increase, they reduce the available General Revenue (GR) funding for the agency.

The Executive Director is the only exempt position within our agency. The salary for this position is governed by the General Appropriations Act, which sets a "not-to-exceed" rate for the Executive Director's annual base salary. However, it has become apparent that the current rate is insufficient and poses a significant challenge for the agency in terms of recruiting, retaining and rewarding a qualified individual for this critical role. To address these concerns, we propose an adjustment to the "not-to-exceed" rate for the Executive Director's salary. We recommend increasing the rate to \$129,765, which aligns with the maximum of the "Recommended Salary Range" as specified in the "Executive Compensation at State Agencies" report administered by the State Auditor's Office. This adjustment is essential to ensure that our compensation package remains competitive and reflective of current market conditions.

EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS:

The "not-to-exceed" rate established for the Executive Director is out of alignment with market conditions and the rising cost of living. This this misalignment will hinder the agency's ability to attract, retain or reward top talent, particularly given the competitive market for executive roles. Unlike employees classified under the State's Position Classification Plan, the Executive Director does not benefit from salary increases such as merit raises or one-time bonuses, making it even more challenging to offer a competitive compensation package.
